"Marshall" - does not go out of its way to impress

Chadwick Boseman has played some of the most influential historical figures of our time: Jackie Robinson, James Brown... and Black Panther. He now plays Thurgood Marshall, who will eventually become the first African-American Supreme Court Justice. But this is not about Marshall's life story or his rise to fame.

Boseman leads a terrific cast that includes Josh Gad, Dan Stevens, James Cromwell, Kate Hudson and Sterling K. Brown. Everyone is there to give this very important true story some depth and weight. At the same time, the screenplay never gets too caught up in its own self-importance. While some very dark themes and tragic events are present, there is a sense of humor pervading in a good portion of the film. This makes the people and events portrayed in "Marshall" related somewhat, instead of feeling like we're watching a group of untouchable, stoic historical figures.

"Marshall" isn't designed to inspire anger or guilt, instead it encourages us to examine examples of unity that have been used to overcome struggle. It has more in common with films like "The Help" or "Hidden Figures," than more aggressive films like "Detroit" (though that film is very intense and impressive).

I would say Marshall will not play well watching it at home on a TV screen as it does in a Big screen theater, because there is something about seeing it with a audience, which adds pleasure to the experience. The gasps of the audience when an atrocity is displayed, the clapping when a bigot loses his/her battle-it is a good film to enjoy with an audience.

From a technical standpoint, the film does not go out of its way to impress. The cinematography, costume and production design, music, editing all seems serviceable if not particularly memorable. However, if you are looking for an engaging and entertaining courtroom drama, then "Marshall" will do the job!







TALL TALE FROM VIENNA GRAVEYARD



Moments in time THE HISTORY CHANNEL

- On Oct. 20, 1944, U.S. Gen. Douglas MacArthur wades ashore onto the Philippine island of Leyte, fulfilling his vow to return to the area he was forced to flee in 1942 under orders from President Franklin Roosevelt.
- On Oct. 21, 1959, the Guggenheim Museum, home to one of the world's top collections of contemporary art, opens in New York City. The bizarrely shaped white concrete building resembled a giant upside-down cupcake. Today, 900,000-plus visitors visit the Guggenheim yearly.

never had a lonely Halloween since.











Beware of Dropping Drawers!

e've lived through a dramatic few weeks ... to say the least. Hurricanes to the East and South, runaway fires in the West, earthquakes in Mexico,

tornadoes everywhere, and now a mass shooting like no other in Las Vegas of

all places, our favorite party town. If ever there was a time begging for release from all the horror and tension, it is now. Luckily, we have a salve at the ready. Nothing lifts the spirits (and provides "the best medicine") like honest-to-goodness, deep-fromthe-belly laughter.

The timing of Main Street Players' latest production couldn't have been more fortuitous. When Steve Martin adapts a century-old German farce that pokes fun at bourgeois snobbery and conformity, you know it's going to be a hoot, to say the least. "The Underpants," adapted from Carl Sternheim's 1911 play, "Die Hose," left Miami Lakes audiences gasping for air. Director Danny Nieves definitely accomplished his mission: to present a play "about one thing, and one thing only: FUN."

In the spirit of such much-needed fun, I'm going to put aside, for now, all the little sexist cringes I endured at the outset. Like when small-minded, pompous, civil-service clerk Theo Maske, who feels his job hinges on "blending in," tells his striking wife: "You are much too attractive for a man in my position. Everyone notices you. So I don't buy you a new dress "

The play opens with Theo (played by Michael Fernandez to a tee) as the clueless, blustering chauvinist who lives for order and conformity panicking over a very public accident that happened to his dreamy, mismatch-of-the-century wife, Louise, while they attended the King's parade. Opting for a better view, Louise climbed to a raised perch and, as she stretched up, her underpants suddenly loosened and dropped down to her ankles. To her husband's utter humiliation and frenzied fear of losing face, and his minor government position.

This is an era of ankle-length hoop skirts and kneelength bloomers (hardly revealing though silky). Louise, another perfect casting in Sheri Wieseman, totally downplays her husband's panic, explaining

that once she realized her panties had fallen, she quickly swept them off and away. She says it happened in seconds and no one even noticed.

But there she's very, very wrong. For in fact, she'd attracted the attention and heated desires of one well-off, literary man-about-town (Steven A. Chambers as Frank Versati) and a sickly young Jewish nebbish (played to the sneezing hilt by Anthony Wolff) who cons gullible Theo into accepting him when introduced as Benjamin Cohen with a "K." His character, an over-the-top caricature, constantly digs at early twentieth century German society's unapologetic anti-Semitism. Both these suitors -phonies each in their own way (pretentious Frank Versati is soon revealed as a mere "wannabe" poet and writer) -- end up sharing the spare "Room for Rent* in the Maske household.

And when the forever "-aspiring" poet (now it's time

to take a jab at the literati class) comes a-calling with Louise's full encouragement, we can no longer simply blame "the husband" for their marital woes. Forty-two-year-old nosy, upstairs spinster Gertrude Deuter (hilarious Lucy E. Nunez) is Louise's biggest champion, intent on promoting the affair and living vicariously through her young protégé. That is until she, too, proves fickle and an unworthy friend when unexpectedly wooed by Theo who professes: "I want to sleep with you, it won't take but a minute."

Toward the end, two more potential boarders make an appearance: Elderly Kinglehoff (Murphy Hayes) who can't abide any reference to lewdness ... lest he turn into a foul-mouthed madman, which he does. And last, but not least, the King himself, declaring his desire for an out-of-the-way refuge. But we all know he's really after Louise, besotted by the sudden reveal of her underpants as he paraded by.

Clueless Theo, delighted that all these paying boarders have finally provided enough income to start a family, is ready for sex now with his wife (which hereto only happened once, on their wedding night, as he felt he could not yet afford children). Perhaps I'm the only one still feeling sorry for Louise, tossed willy-nilly into the roles of wife, muse, object of desire -- with no attention to her own personal development and desires, unless they are secretly sought. Her situation is exemplative of the times, but still.... Politics aside, most everyone in the audience simply found this outrageously silly premise for a play very, very funny. All thanks to the guiding hands of a very talented production staff, crew and cast.

I'd like to make special note of the set whose parlor furnishings, complete with lacy tablecloth spread upon a claw-footed dining table, provided the perfect period centerpiece for the action. Main Street Players, long-celebrated for their authentic set design, outdid themselves yet again, thanks to set designers Amanda Sparhawk (also credited with lighting design) and Angie Esposito, and the evercreative, detail-oriented construction work of Dennis Lyzniak and crew. Angie Esposito's well-fitted, elegant costuming, particularly on the women, further served to draw us into the era.
