## Houstonians Excited About Bahamasair's New Non Stop Service Into Houston From Nassau

mployees of The Bahamas Ministry of Tourism and Aviation (MOTA), along with executives of Bahamasair and Bahamas tourism industry partners, recently spent a week in Houston conducting sales and public relations blitzes to top tour operators, travel agencies airport executives and media professionals, in that area. The team was on a mission to promote Bahamasair's new twice weekly, non-stop services into Houston's Bush International (IAH) Airport from Nassau.

The new 737-500 series service will depart IAH at 8:00 a. m. and arrive Nassau at 11:00 a. m. on Mondays and Thursdays. Its outbound flight from Nassau's LPIA departs Nassau at 4:00 p. m. every Sunday and Wednesday, arriving into Houston by 7:10 p. m.

Led by Woodrow Wilson, Sr. Sales Manager at Bahamasair and Prescott Young, Area Manager at The Bahamas Tourist Office (BTO) Houston, The Bahamas team comprised Bahamasair's sales, marketing and operations executives, employees of the BTO Plantation and Houston offices as well as representatives from the British Colonial Hilton Resort and Majestic Tours.

In addition to promoting Bahamasair's low introductory round trip rate of \$445 per person, with first bag free, the group also used the opportunity to highlight the multiple vacation destinations that are all open for business and available in The Bahamas' 700 islands chain.

Eighty of the top-producing travel agencies in nine key markets in the greater Houston and southwest Texas areas were visited. Seminars and presentations were also conducted to top tier producers and suppliers of Unique Vacations, Vacation Express, Vacations To Go, AAA Travel, Apple Vacations, Travel Spectrum, Modern Vacations Funjet 500 Clubs, Travel Lifestyles and Sandals as well as members of the Professional Travel Agents Association of North America. The team also exhibited at the Zina Garrison Fun Day in MacGregor Park. The consumer event attracted a wide mixture of people from government officials and professional athletes to senior citizens and neighborhood children.

NFL ticket sales at TickPick slumped 17.9 percent this week, compared with the prior week, their steepest decline since 2014, while sales at TicketCity plunged 31 percent. For pro football games in September, ticket sales at TicketCity are down 16 percent from a year ago. The NFL has already lost millions due to the ticket sales and loss of sponsors. They will rake in roughly \$4.6 billion in television fees from CBS, Walt Disney-owned ESPN, Comcast-owned NBC, Fox and DirecTV, that will equally be shared with its 32 teams this year. The NFL commands such a rich bounty because advertisers pay up for football's huge ratings. The television money is a big reason why the average NFL team is worth \$2.34 billion and the average NFL player earns \$2.1 million. The networks that televise the games barely mention the protests anymore. But

the fans have not forgotten.

If the NFL loses its fan base, it will also lose Television ratings, and as a direct result lose TV revenue. Who's going to pay those overpaid football players if the television money drops? Remember, it's only entertainment. The fans can lose interest and find something or somewhere else to entertain themselves.

#### FOOD FOR THOUGHT

Most of you have heard of the Deep State. If you haven't, then it's time you found out. In the <u>United</u>

Citibank, Chase Manhattan, Morgan Guaranty Trust, Chemical Bank, Manufacturers Hanover Trust, Bankers Trust Company, National Bank of North America, and the Bank of New York (Mullins, p. 179) together own about 63 percent of the New York Fed's outstanding stock. Mullins then showed that many of these banks are owned by about a dozen European banking organizations, mostly British, and most notably the Rothschild Banking Dynasty ("The RBD"). Through their American agents, The RBD is able to select the board of directors for the New York Fed and to direct U.S. monetary policy. Mullins explained. The question is if they were part of our government, why is it we can't audit them?

Congressman Ron Paul has been trying to get a bill passed through the congress to do just that and can't get anywhere. Remember, they control our entire monetary system!

Mr. Lou Gamboa for his research of the Constitution and our banking system: Lou Gamboa is a national speaker on the subject, and has spoken on numerous radio programs in an effort to educate the public. ARTICLE 1, SECTION 8 OF THE CONSTITUTION STATES THAT CONGRESS SHALL HAVE THE POWER TO COIN (CREATE) MONEY

The great body of the people, mentally incapable of comprehending, will bear its burden without complaint, and perhaps without even suspecting that the system is inimical (contrary) to their interests." [The bankers created the legislation for the FED] In 1913, before the Senate Banking and Currency Committee, Mr. Alexander stated: "But the whole scheme of a Federal Reserve Bank with its commercial-paper basis is an impractical, cumbersome machinery,

is simply a cover, to find a way to secure the privilege of issuing money and to evade payment of as much tax upon circulation as possible, and then control the issue and maintain, instead of reduce, interest rates. It is a system that, if inaugurated, will prove to the advantage of the few and the detriment of the people of the United States. It will mean continued shortage of actual money and further extension of credits; for when there is a lack of real money, people have to borrow credit to their cost."

The Federal Reserve Bank ("The Fed") began with approximately 300 people or banks that became owners in the Federal Reserve Banking System (stockholders purchasing stock at \$100 per share - the stock is not publicly traded). They make up an international banking cartel of wealth beyond comparison (Reference 1, The Fed banking system collects billions of dollars (Reference 8, 17) in interest annually and distributes the profits to its shareholders. The Congress illegally gave the Fed the right to print money (through the Treasury) at no interest to the Fed. They create money from nothing, and loans it back to us through banks, and charges interest to us on our currency. The Fed also buys Government debt with money printed on a printing press and charges U.S. taxpayers interest. Many Congressmen and Presidents say this is fraud (Reference 1,2,3,5,17).

Who actually owns the Federal Reserve Central Banks? The ownership of the 12 Central banks, a very well kept secret, has been revealed: Rothschild Bank of London, Warburg Bank of Hamburg, Rothschild Bank of Berlin, Lehman Brothers of New York, Lazard Brothers of Paris, Kuhn Loeb Bank of New York, Israel Moses Seif Banks of Italy, Goldman, Sachs of New York, Warburg Bank of Amsterdam, and Chase Manhattan Bank of New York (Reference 14, P. 13, Reference 12, P. 152) Presidents Jackson, Lincoln, and Kennedy tried to stop this family of bankers by printing U.S. dollars without charging the taxpayers interest (Reference 4). Forty percent of our personal federal income taxes go to pay this interest. The FED's books are not open to the public. Congress has yet to audit it. If you want to know who controls the Deep State, maybe you should start with The Federal Reserve.





Lady Bird worries that people can tell she's from Sacramento, which she calls "the Midwest of California". They argue about work ethic, which leads to a shocking yet hilarious end to the scene. There's so much resentment, anger, and yet, true care on display, all of which will find their way into the rest of the story.

Although on the surface, this can be described as your typical coming-of-age story, it's the tone, the writing, the performances, the direction, and the

mother-daughter bond that sets it apart. With that, we know this film will have something more on its mind than boobs and drunken nights, although they do play a part here as well! It's really, though, perhaps the best depiction of a parent/child relationship with all of its conflicting emotions butted up against each other, since 'Terms of Endearment.'

A scene where they argue in a thrift shop only to come together over the perfect dress illustrates this point wonderfully. By emphasizing the prickly bond between mom and daughter, director, Gerwig upends the tropes often seen in many high school stories. Oftentimes, these tales are about the girl getting the guy and it's to this movie's credit that this relationship will help Lady Bird figure out who she is and what she wants to be. However she's gonna meet other guys. Lady Bird, will have a few failed relationships, but she'll incorporate them just as she does with the sights, smells and sounds of the hometown she can't wait to escape but may some day learn to appreciate.

Her last year in school carries a lot of the humor in the film, from her run-ins with a strict but caring Nun, played by Lois Smith. Much is presented in breezy montages that don't have that cheap, lazy storytelling quality we're so accustomed to getting. The actors feel so comfortable on camera, making this a joy to watch from beginning to end. This movie grabbed me when I least expected it to do so. It's with this attention to the writing, editing and cinematography, that Gerwig, establishes herself as a formidable filmmaker. Greta Gerwig is the real deal. So is this lovely, wonderful, memorable, beautiful film. \* \* \* \* out of \* \* \* \* my highest rating!--- Wonderful!

## **Dream On!**

Kevin Black is back! Back in time to one of his (and our) favorite musical eras. And back to staging and directing block-buster hits at Margate's Stage Door Theatre (with two popular productions co-running in both theaters this season, it's as if he's never left).

Black's latest, Dreamgirls, is a nostalgic romp through the Motown sound of the sixties to early seventies — a decade defined by major strides for women and minorities in the entertainment industry. But as is always the case when looking back toward "the good old days," the times were never all that good for everyone. Breaking racial barriers didn't shield talented black women from the effects of sexism, the brutality of ruthless ambition, or the entanglements and heartbreak that often accompany tender young lives.

Loosely based (or not so loosely, depending on whom you ask) on the experiences of successful rags-to-riches R&B groups like The Supremes and The Shirelles, Dreamgirls' original name of "Dreamettes" even echoes The Supremes' first moniker, "The Primettes." Despite numerous similarities in their story lines -- heartily endorsed by original Supreme member Mary Wilson while disputed by Diana Ross -- book writer Tom Eyen insists his original script was simply inspired by the musical legends of his youth.

Whatever the case, the show features larger-than-life characters whose musical and promotional talents take a back seat to no one. The episodes of their lives, vibrantly portrayed in song, abound with themes of familial and romantic love, friendship, jealousy, anger, betrayal, and eventual forgiveness. The show spans ten years, culminating with a farewell performance among the three original vocalists (and a fourth replacement addition) before they disband and bravely go forth to pursue new, individual passions. It was a pleasure to watch these strong-willed and super-talented young ladies grow both personally and professionally. Despite setbacks and disappointments, they managed to stay

afloat and even thrive within the treacherous, maledominated waters of the era's pop music industry.

Music and lyrics by Henry Krieger include so many memorable numbers, you'll find yourself singing and humming show tunes days — and even weeks — later. It's no wonder that Dreamgirls, which opens with a talent contest (all great performances) at Harlem's legendary Apollo Theater, was nominated for 13 Tony awards after its Broadway debut in 1981. (They won six.)

Dreamgirls is all about the music, and the songs: they represent both currency and reputation. An early hit "Cadillac Car" loses its place on the charts when recorded as a cover by an established white pop band (Dave and the Sweethearts aka Joshua Conner, Natalie McPherson and Sandi Stock). But first we get to enjoy full-blown versions sung by our show's magnificent stars: Curtis (Don Seward), Jimmy (Elijah Word), CC (Andre Russell), Marty (James White), later joined by Dreamettes Effie (Sarah Gracel), Deena (Charisse Shields) and Lorell (Sheena O. Murray). They sound fantastic but at this point (just starting out) they feel there's nothing they can do to reclaim their song.

Contrast this scenario to what happens ten years

later. Effie, always a force to be reckoned with and the strongest/loudest voice on stage, strikes out on her own with a slow, soulful rendition of "One Night Only." Manager Curtis can't stand her showing up his choice for the girls (he insists a fast, Disco-style dance beat is the wave of the future) and has his reconfigured Dreamgirls trio (sans Effie) release the same song to a pop, Disco vibe. Through payoffs and illicit maneuverings, his version begins to rise above Effie's ballad on the charts. But this time her manager takes legal action and fights back.

Managers can't always be trusted, they are often manipulative and self-interested, but can also make or break careers. When they fall in and out of love with their talent — as Curtis did first with Effie and then with Deena — it can break up not only groups but families, as well. (Take the seven-year affair between married Jimmy and young-and- impressionable Lorrell. Or Effie's secret, fatherless child.) There's plenty of personal growth to be achieved throughout the decade of the show — and not just musically. Happily, despite all their cuts and scrapes, the protagonists end on a rousing, positive note.

Every voice in this elaborate musical filled with showstopping song-and-dance numbers was pitch perfect and top notch. My compliments to choreographer Danny Durr and musical director James Weber. The simple yet striking bi-level set design by Ardean Landhuis, whose talents include lighting design, was all that was needed to showcase the large, professional cast of 18. Changes between scenes and musical numbers were kept smoothly running thanks to tech director Paul O'Donnell, stage manager Nancy Clay, ASM/ sound engineer Rushnay Henry and ASM/backstage Amanda Eisele.

And what can I say about Jerry Sturdefant's neverending, dazzling costume designs that were so impressive that had the cast been less talented, they would have been downright distracting! The ladies' sparkling gowns and even the lads' flashy tuxedos present a kaleidoscope-like fancy-dress show of their own.



## Is The Plaza At Oceanside One still having Construction Problems?

ikki's Orange Kitchen at the northwest corner of A1A and Atlantic Beach Blvd has been flooding out and owner Nikki Marchelos was like, what's going on? It doesn't smell like rain water. What happened was that since June of this year, the building management was trying to blame their plumbing issues on her contractor because her restaurant was flooding out every time it rained. One ancestor, James Turner Sykes name is in a very important document and books in Washington because he fought the British. Her Brother was in Vietnam, in the Air Force. Her father was in the Navy. The man in charge at the time, David Ornell, was super nice and he said that she could have any sign she wanted on her place. Her sign was approved in writing by that board. By the time she opened up, it was a totally new board and Mr. Ornell had sold his place and moved. The new board started giving her a hard time, all because of the sign. She told them that it was approved and asked "why now don't you want to approve me?" She has been stepped on, harassed and abused in every which way.

She even made sure she did everything right and even put in items better than needed to make sure it was top notch. Her menu is organic and healthy. She put the God Bless America sign in May and in August the Homeowner's Association sent her a notice that she couldn't have the mural on her door. She called a lawyer, the same lawyer she had to call to get her sign up. He went to the Association and said you guys are being ridiculous. This is a beautiful sign that says God Bless America. Nikki is going to change them as the season changes and can we just get approval. They said no. They didn't even review it. It was an immediate denial. In the meantime, the harassment doesn't stop. They even changed the security personnel who have been instructed to bully and harass Nikki. She was told by some of Continued on Page 13

They were talking about the pipes and what has to be done, etc...and the customers are sitting there trying to eat their food. No one else was sitting outside and the two men made sure they had their conversation right on top of the customers. Finally Nikki's husband Spiro told them to move away. Nikki has been so nice to all of them at the building, and they have done nothing but bully her. She has never seen anything like it. How can they treat people this way, and how can they treat such a beautiful person like Nikki so horribly? If the problem is a defect in construction in the building would she have a right to sue for loss of business and damages?



## What Is Toys For Tots?

n 1947 Diane Hendricks asked her husband, Bill, a major with the U.S. Marine Corps Reserves in Los Angeles to deliver a doll she had made to an agency that gave toys to needy children at Christmastime. He soon discovered that no such agency existed, so Diane encouraged him to start one. That Christmas, Bill and a group of Marine reservists delivered 5,000 toys.

Nationwide, there are 2.7 million grandparents raising grandchildren. About a fifth have incomes that fall below the poverty line, according the Census figures.
